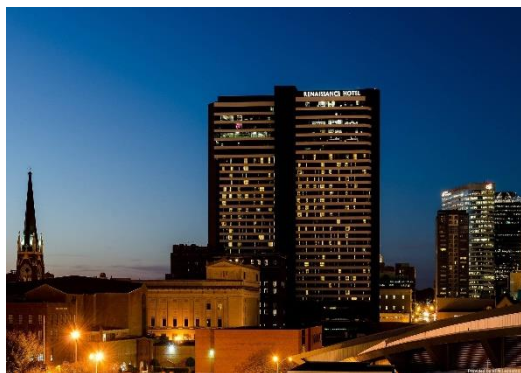

Rest in Peace, Man, in this Groovy VW Columbarium

The generation who brought us the Summer of Love, Woodstock, and the Manson family are now in their seventies and eighties. Many are making final arrangements for when they move on to that eternal hippie commune in the sky. Luckily, a cemetery in Eugene, Oregon now offers a 1960s-inspired groovy repository where their earthly remains can rest in peace and love — a place that's just as unconventional as their flower child lifestyle. Yes, you can now opt to have your cremains stored within a 1972 Volkswagen van, along with up to 99 other like-minded folks. With its eye-catching psychedelic paint job, including the words “peace” and “love” on either side, the van stands as an homage to the age of Aquarius.

The Peace Garden Columbarium, is the creation of Jeff and Mark Musgrove of Musgrove Family Mortuaries & Cemeteries, was unveiled in 2017 within the family's Lane Memorial Gardens in Eugene. The van is permanently anchored on a concrete pad under a spacious canopy built to protect the vehicle and allow for memorial services. During these services, the directors open the trunk of the van and place the urn and floral arrangements on a custom-made shelf adorned with a tie-dyed peace sign.



Later, urns are placed on wooden shelves within the van. A plaque with the deceased's name, date of birth, and date of death is mounted on one of the six Douglas fir posts supporting the canopy. The Musgrove family tasked mechanic Cody Rushing with locating and rehabbing the VW columbarium. Rushing restored the rusting body, replaced emblems, windows and original parts, and added solar panels to power the headlights, which will remain on, only if dimly, 24/7.

Todd W. Van Beck

February 15, 1952 — May 23, 2023



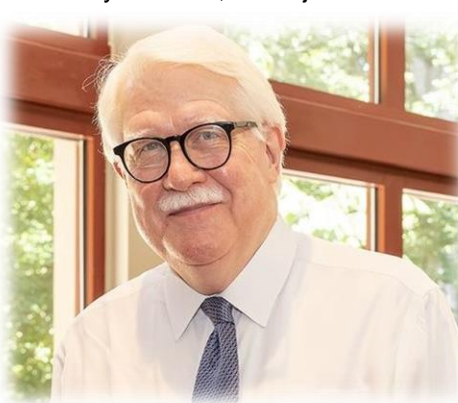
TODD WESLEY VAN BECK, passed away on Tuesday, May 23, 2023. Beloved father of Thomas Van Beck. Loving son of the late Thomas Anthony "Tony" and Norma Jean (nee Feekin) Van Beck. Dear brother of Scott (Sarah) Van Beck; and uncle of Wesley, Helen, Sam and Neil Van Beck.

Todd was a person who had a half-century love affair with both funeral and cemetery service. He willingly admitted that he was, "no expert!", but also quickly admitted that there was nothing about this work and life that he did not enjoy, and have intense interest in. Todd had said: "have never done a day's work in my life, it has all been fun and interesting."

Todd earned his Professional Diploma in Mortuary Science in 1973 from the New England Institute of Funeral Service Arts and Sciences (MA), his Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and Psychology from Mount Mercy University (IA), and his Master of Arts in Religion from Athenaeum of Ohio (Mount Saint Mary's Seminary). In 2005, he was awarded the Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters Degree from Commonwealth Institute of Funeral Service, (Houston, TX). Todd held several certifications and licensures, including the Certified Funeral Service Practitioner (CFSP), Certified Funeral Executive (CFE), and licensure in several states.

Prior to his employment as Program Director at Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science (CCMS), Todd served as Faculty/Director of Continuing Education at John A. Gupton College (TN); General Manager of Forest Hill Funeral Homes & Memorial Parks (TN); Director of Family Funeral Care and Public Relations at A.S. Turner & Sons Funeral Home (GA); President and CEO of the Commonwealth Institute of Funeral Service (TX); and Director of Education for the Loewen Group, Inc. (OH). His academic career began at CCMS in 1982.

Todd was an active writer and speaker internationally for many decades covering most every topic that is relevant to our profession. He authored 8 books and over 400 articles on death care topics. A historian and academician, Mr. Van Beck grew up in Southwestern Iowa and declared at the young age of 5 years old that he would become a funeral director when he grew up. As he often said, he was still growing up, still learning, still trying to make some kind or worthy contribution to his beloved profession. Todd operated funeral homes, cemeteries, and mortuary colleges during his career. Todd selflessly served the death care profession in many arenas across the nation and internationally, which satisfied his desire to see the world. He was thrilled and humbled to return to CCMS where he planned to continue his mission until retirement. Visitation took place on Saturday, May 27, 2023 from 12 noon until 2 PM at the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science, 645 W North Bend Rd, Cincinnati, OH 45224. A Masonic Blue Lodge service began at 2 PM, followed by a Celebration of Life service. Additional visitation was held on Tuesday, May 30, 2023 at Hancock Methodist Church, 204 Kimball St., Hancock, IA 51536 from 12 Noon until time of service at 2 PM, followed by interment at Oak Hill Cemetery in Hancock, Iowa. In lieu of flowers, the family request donations to be made to the "Todd Van Beck Memorial Scholarship Fund" at CCMS. Arrangements were handled by the Cincinnati College of Mortuary Science, in conjunction with Vorhis & Ryan Funeral Home.

He was a wonderful man and took pride in what he loves, prayers to his family and friends during this difficult time 🙏

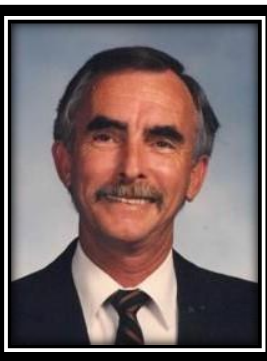
It was such an honor to be able to study under him. He will definitely be missed!

GREEN BURIALS

Green (or natural) burial emphasizes simplicity and environmental sustainability. The body is neither cremated nor prepared with chemicals such as embalming fluids. It is simply placed in a biodegradable coffin or shroud and interred without a concrete burial vault. The goal is complete decomposition of the body and its natural return to the soil. Only then can a burial truly be “ashes to ashes, dust to dust,” a phrase so often used when we bury our dead.

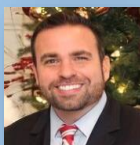
